Planning Ahead

Are there two exits from every room in your home?Yes	No
Are exit routes kept clear?Yes	No
Do you know how to quickly notify your local fire department?Yes	No
Does your home have working smoke detectors on every floor and in or near all bedrooms?	No
Do you change the batteries in your smoke detectors twice a year (The start and end of Daylight Savings time is an easy way to remember.)	No
Have you conducted a fire drill?Yes	No
Safe Smoking Habits	
Is smoking in bed prohibited in your home?Yes	No
Do you make sure that cigarette butts, cigar ends, and pipe ashes are completely extinguished before they are placed in the garbage can or dumpster?Yes	No
Are matches and lighters kept out of reach of children?	No
<u>Furnaces, Heaters, Stove/Oven, Hot Plates</u>	
Are furnaces, stoves, and stovepipes kept in good repair and located far enough away from combustible walls and ceilings so that they do not create a hazard?Yes	No
Are portable space heaters properly maintained and kept at least three feet from people, curtains, bedding, or furniture?	No

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Are portable space heaters and hot plates turned off and unplugged when you leave the room, your home, or when you are sleeping?Yes	No
Do you have an annual inspection of your heating system? It should be cleaned and checked every year	No
Do you keep curtains, sleeves, potholders, food packages, etc., away from the stove when cooking?	No
Do you turn off the oven and/or stove when you are finished using it?Yes	No
<u>Electricity</u>	
Are electrical cords in good condition – no cracks or fraying?Yes	No
Do you take care that extension cords are never run under rugs, over doorways, or hooked over nails?	No
Do you avoid using extension cords whenever possible?Yes	No
If necessary, do you use properly sized extension cords? (High-wattage appliances require heavy-duty cords.)	No
When the breaker "trips" or a fuse blows, do you investigate WHY it happened? Do you remove excess appliances from a breaker circuit that frequently "trips"?Yes	No
Is the correct size fuse (20 amps for lighting circuits) in each socket in the fuse box? (If you don't know the correct size, contact your landlord.)	No
Is your TV well-ventilated? Allow air space around the TV and other appliances to prevent overheatingYes	No

If you have a fireplace, do you utilize a fireplace screen to prevent sparks from igniting items?	No
Are combustible materials (rugs, fire starters) kept far enough away that sparks cannot ignite them?Yes	No
Has your chimney been inspected and cleaned within the last year?Yes	No
